An adjective clause (also called relative clause) is a dependent clause that modifies a noun or pronoun. It tells which one or what kind. Adjective clauses almost always come right after the nouns they modify. There is the mountain that we are going to climb. My blue tennis shoes, which used to be my mom's, were under the bed.

Adjective Clause An adjective clause is a multiword adjective that includes a subject and a verb. When we think of an adjective, we usually think about a single word used before a noun to modify its meanings (e.g., tall building, smelly cat, argumentative assistant). However, an adjective can also come in the form of an adjective clause.
